Dear All,

The McKay Christmas Party took place on Sunday December 9th, which spurred me into action to write our annual letter before Christmas arrived. Because of certain other events, however, I am now writing it a few days after Christmas.

Our major news is, of course, James and Elsa's wedding on August 18th. The wedding at the Sharon Temple went exceptionally well, and
